


Number One Is having a run.

Past continuous and Past simple

B. He was writing a note with his new fountain pen.

A. Did you read his note?

B. No, I didn't. The only thing I could see was the first word at the top of his note.

A. Do you remember this word?

B. Yes. He wrote the word ten.

A. Ten?! Very strange!

B. It isn't strange.

His favourite number is ten and his name is Number Ten.
